

# Memorandum of Understanding

between

# Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica (Costa Rica)

and

# The University of Winnipeg (Canada)

The University of Winnipeg and the Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica, wishing to establish relations between the two institutions, agree to cooperate with each other as follows:

# Scope of the Cooperation

Subject to mutual consent, the areas of cooperation will include any program offered at either institution as thought desirable and feasible on either side and that both sides think will contribute to the fostering and development of the cooperative relationship between the two universities.

Cooperation shall be carried out through such activities as, but not limited to:

- a. Exchange of faculty and/or staff
- b. Exchange of students<sup>1</sup>
- c. Joint research activities and publications
- d. Participation in seminars and academic meetings
- e. Exchange of academic materials and other information
- f. Special short-term academic programs
- g. Academic programs that may include arrangements such as dual degree, transfer agreements, 2 + 1, or 1 + 3.





<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> All incoming students to The University of Winnipeg are responsible to pay non-tuition student fees (such as, UWSA Athletic Levy, Facility Fee, UWSA Non-Refundable Fee, Wellness Centre Fee), and International student health insurance. The number of students participating in the exchange program is intended to be balanced and reciprocal for each year. A maximum of three (3) students per year incoming /outgoing may participate in the Exchange for one or two terms, on the condition of equal exchange of students. Each university will inform the other of the intended number of exchange students by March 1<sup>st</sup> (for Fall/ Winter Term) and November 1<sup>st</sup> (for Spring Term) of each year. Should participation levels be unequal in any given year, each additional incoming student to The University of Winnipeg will pay a \$300 administration fee once per academic year to The University of Winnipeg.

The terms of cooperation for each specific activity implemented under this *Memorandum* of *Understanding* shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity. Any such agreements entered into, as outlined above, will form appendices to this *Memorandum of Understanding*. Each institution shall designate a liaison officer to develop and coordinate the specific activities agree upon.

## APPENDIX

#### STUDENT EXCHANGE

#### BETWEEN

# THE INSTITUTO TECNOLÓGICO DE COSTA RICA

#### AND

#### THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG

The Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica and The University of Winnipeg will participate in the exchange of students under the following terms. These details will serve to provide the working framework for the academic exchange program.

- 1. The duration of the exchange is to be for one or two terms/semesters (September-August).
- 2. Each institution shall exchange a maximum of three (3) students per academic year on a one-for-one basis. The actual number of students to be exchanged will be determined every year by mutual consultation in advance. Any imbalance in the number of students exchanged in one year shall be rectified by adjusting the numbers in the following year to bring the exchange into balance. If for any reason there remains an imbalance in the numbers exchanged, each additional incoming student to The University of Winnipeg will pay a \$300 administration fee. Likewise, if for any reason there remains an imbalance in the numbers exchanged, each additional incoming student to The Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica will pay a \$300 administration fee.
- 3. Notification of the number of students to be exchanged should be given in writing to the other institution at least six months in advance of the semester in which the exchange is to occur. This shall occur no later than March 1 for Fall and/ or Winter Term/Semester admission, and November 1 for the Spring Term/Semester.
- 4. Exchange students are subject to the rules and regulations of the host institution and the laws of the county where they will reside.
- The students who participate in the exchange program will be initially selected by the home institution, and the host institution will make the final decision of admission in each case.
- 6. The students will determine the detailed study plan at the host institution, in consultation with academic advisors of both home and host institutions.

- 7. The students must possess the level of language proficiency that is required by the host institution in order to be accepted, and complete the appropriate course of study, should it be necessary to meet the standard.
- 8. The host institution will evaluate the academic performance of each student according to its rules. An academic record/transcript will be provided when requested by the exchange student. This will be done in accordance with the procedures/policies of the host institution. The home institution may give academic credits to each student according to its regulations.
- 9. The host institution will waive academic tuition fees for the incoming exchange students. Each exchange student is responsible for payment of transportation, housing and meal expenses, health insurance, books, and incidental expenses. All incoming students to The University of Winnipeg are responsible to pay non-tuition student fees (such as, UWSA Athletic Levy, Facility Fee, UWSA Non-Refundable Fee, Wellness Centre Fee). Likewise, all incoming students to The Instituto Tecnológico de Costa Rica are responsible to pay non-tuition student fees. Assistance will be provided by the host institution to locate suitable living accommodation.
- 10. This Appendix will be effective as of the date of the signing of the General MoU, and shall remain in force for the same period as the General MoU.
- 11. Variation from the above terms may be possible by mutual consent.
